Dear Cadillac Board of Officers:

During the 2019 Midyear Conference of the Michigan Moose Association, the Loyal Order of Moose unanimously approved moving forward with a program, inviting the Chapters within the Michigan Moose Association to join with them in their objective to:

Aid and promote the purposes of the Loyal Order of Moose.

Build the membership strength of the Order.

Stimulate participation in Community Service programs.

 Adopt programs and projects for the betterment of Mooseheart and Moosehaven to include the building of the Endowment Fund for the support of these institutions.

Coordinate the programs and directives of Moose International, Inc. and the Supreme Lodge.

This is relatively new within the Moose Fraternity and is a very exciting opportunity.

In accordance with the procedures established by Moose International and the Women of the Moose, all Chapters within the Michigan Moose Association are now required to call a special meeting of their membership to determine if the Chapter is willing to become a part of this program and join the Association.

Enclosed, you will find a "sample" notice to be sent to every member of the Chapter at least seven (7) days in advance of the special meeting, via first class mail. Members who have an email address on file may receive notification via email. In calculating the seven (7) days notice requirement, the Chapter shall not count the day of mailing or the date of the special meeting.

Also enclosed you will find the Special Membership Meeting Minutes to be completed during the meeting. A copy of minutes must be returned to the Women of the Moose office, indicating the Chapters decision, within (7) days of the meeting.

In order to assure that all members are represented in this vote, we have to account for the large discrepancy between a small chapter such as Hillsdale and a large Chapter such as Fenton. We will be using a system similar to the Electoral College for this vote. There are 374 total votes possible in this process, or 1 for every 50 chapter members, plus one for a majority fraction above an even interval of 50.

The Fenton Chapter has 1211 members, so their Chapter has 24 votes out of 374. All votes will be cast for the same choice as the simple majority of the members vote at the special meeting. If the special meeting vote is yes, all 24 votes will be cast as affirmative. If the special meeting vote is no, all 24 votes will be cast as negative. If your chapter chooses not to or fails to vote and/or fails to report the results before the deadline of June 15, 2019 all 24 of the votes will be cast in the affirmative.

This measure will pass and be binding to all chapters in the Michigan Moose Association jurisdiction if there are 188 or more affirmative votes. It will fail if 188 or more votes are negative.

We are very excited about this opportunity for the members of the Women of the Moose and their Chapters. Providing this issue is favorable among the Chapters, our co-workers will have a voice in the decisions of the South Carolina Moose Association, and its districts, and would be allowed to serve as Association Chairmen, District Presidents and the elected Association Officers.

Chapters would receive the same support and service from the Association that the lodges do. This includes, but is not limited to new member campaigns, training, and Chapter visitations and operations assistance from Moose Association officers and chairs.

Women of the Moose Chapters would pay per-capita between \$1.99 and \$7.60 per member per year based on established criteria. The exact amount would be determined by the number of Women of the Moose members joining the Association.
